love and self-sacrifice for the celebration of our Lord's death and
resurrection. Today we have come together to begin this solemn
celebration in union with the Church throughout the world. Christ
enters his own city to complete his work as our Saviour, to suffer, to
die, and to rise again. Let us go with him in faith and love, so that,
united with him in his sufferings, we may share his risen life.

The people hold up their palms while this prayer is said.

God our Saviour, whose Son Jesus Christ entered Jerusalem as
Messiah to suffer and to die, let these palms be for us signs of his
victory; and grant that we who bear them in his name may ever hail
him as our King, and follow him in the way that leads to eternal life;
who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, now and forever.
Amen.

The Lord's Prayer

**All: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name;

heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our
trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For
thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and
ever. Amen.**

Agnus Dei

**All: Lamb of God, that takest away the sins of the world, have
mercy up on us.**

**Lamb of God, that takest away the sins of the world, grant us thy
peace.**

Giving of Communion

Jesus is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world.

Blessed are those who are called to his supper.

**All: Lord, I am not worthy that thou shouldst come under my
roof, but speak the word only and my soul shall be healed.**

**All: We do not presume to come to this thy table, O merciful Lord,
trusting in our own righteousness, but in thy manifold and great**

mercies. We are not worthy so much as to gather the crumbs under thy table. But thou art the same Lord whose nature is always to have mercy. Grant us, therefore, gracious Lord, so to eat the flesh of thy dear Son Jesus Christ and to drink his blood, that our sinful bodies may be made clean by his body and our souls washed through his most precious blood, and that we may evermore dwell in him, and he in us. Amen

*The priest and people receive communion.
Communicants of all parts of the Church are invited to receive communion. Others who would like to receiving a blessing at the altar rail should carry a book. Children are welcome for a blessing.*

Prayers after Communion

The Post Communion prayer is said followed by:

All: Almighty God, we thank thee for feeding us with the body and blood of thy Son Jesus Christ. Through him we offer thee our souls and bodies to be a living sacrifice. Send us out in the power of thy Spirit to live and work to thy praise and glory. Amen.

The Dismissal

Christ crucified draw you to himself, to find in him a sure ground for faith, a firm support for hope, and the assurance of sins forgiven; and the blessing of God Almighty, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, be with you and remain with you now and always.

All: Amen
